

Visiting Ware Museum

Visitors must sign in - give a name and contact number for themselves (or group) to the Steward on duty.

Visitors must be wearing a mask (under 11s except).

Visitors must sanitise their hand at entrance – please avoid touching exhibits where possible.

Talking figures and interactive map permitted and will be cleaned by Stewards,

Free quiz and pencil available for children (and others).

Sales table – items on the table are priced at £1 each – please leave money in bowl.

Books and postcards may be purchased from Steward at Reception – please place cash in envelope provided.

Please observe social distancing at all times.

Route to be followed with suggestions of what to look at on the way.

Route – one way system in operation – please do not deviate without good reason (pram, wheelchair)

Entrance to Victoria – look at Why Ware is Here? board on left, amphora and Palaeolithic board.

Pass into Canon Gallery to see temporary exhibition – *Educating Ware? or other* then use other doorway to access Victoria Gallery again. Visitors can make purchase at this point or at end of visit.

Move past skeleton and into Hope Gallery (watch for others leaving) and look at River, Road and Rail boards part of Fire Brigade display and GSK display. Barge lady at top of stairs – button may be pressed.

Pass down stairs to Command Bunker (Evacuee on stairs) – first section contains displays on Rationing and Civil Defence. When clear move into second section – display on boards about WWI and WWII, Search Light, and film. (Dressing-up clothes have been removed and Dig is closed.)

Move up ramp and into garden – Wickham's Trolley, Grave Stones, Rudder, Mine and Hertfordshire Puddingstone.

When clear pass into Star Gallery and view boards and displays also interactive map and talking figures and Priory Well (please don't walk on Well). (Toys have been put away for the time being.)

When clear move into Hope Gallery – New River to right and everything else to left - Schools and Work House, second side of Fire Brigade, Hunsdon House, Medieval, Geology and small finds cabinets. When clear walk through into Victoria and turn left to exit. Please check out so that we can keep a track of numbers in Museum.

Should you wish to make a purchase at this point please take care to avoid others passing through Victoria Gallery.
